Solar Panels

WoW Mum Senia Dedic has been chosen this spring by Mayor of Wandsworth as a Community Champion a resident who has been committed and involved over a considerable period of time in her community to improve the life of all her neighbors. Senia has been awarded a small sum of money by Wandsworth Housing Department to support her initiatives in the community and also to take on a special projects on behalf of her estate, area or block. Senia has chosen to invest the funds in solar power, with aim to form a community solar power plant, where people without an adequate roof for solar panels can buy a solar panel optimally positioned elsewhere in the community and have free

production. It is very encouraging that Wandsworth Council is already investing in solar power and have placed solar panels on the Town Hall roof. We hope they will continue with the good work
