ARCH is an association of councils in England, such as Wandsworth, who manage their own council homes. Their annual conference gives tenants the chance to discuss issues surrounding council housing and what this means for them.

Senia Dedic, secretary of the Falcon Road residents' association, was shortlisted for this year's Tenant of the Year award. The judges were so impressed with her community involvement that they awarded her a Highly Commended Certificate. They said; "We wish to acknowledge Senia's tireless efforts to improve her local community and her work with a broad range of local groups."

Senia has been working alongside the council since 2009, when she helped set up the Falcon Road RA. She founded local group WOW Mums (Women of Wandsworth) which

provides support for people with children and is involved with many other local services and groups.

chairperson of the residents' group, said: "I would like to add my own enormous gratitude for all she does for the residents of Falcon estate. It is to her credit that next year will mark the 10th anniversary of Falcon estate RA, which is entirely due to her energy and enthusiasm."
