WoW Mums attended Clinical Commissioning Group's Thinking Partners meeting to promote the health and wellbeing of all people living and

working in Wandsworth. We discuss the Equality Delivery Action event, as well as Wandsworth Joint Prevention Framework and Men's Health Forum.

It is lovely to work with all local groups and organisations on finding solutions to our resident's health problems.

WoW Free Breakfast

WoW Intergenerational Project, funded by BLSWII and People's Health Trust is being praised by Healthwatch, Wandsworth Clinical Commissioning Group and local GPs, who have asked WoW Mums to extend this solution to isolation and loneliness of elderly residents to Roehampton and to Putney. WoW Mums are looking for local family groups in those areas, who could bond with their elderly in sheltered accommodation to form new surrogate families like these in Battersea.

WoW Mums have formulated this inter-generational project based on helping our elderly neighbors, not just through organising free breakfasts and BBQs, but also on every day basis, when we meet them in our homes, streets and shops. It would not make sense for WoW Mums and children to go to Roehampton to bond with their community as a surrogate family. However, WoW Mums would be happy to coach any family group there to organise events and trips for their local residents, to replicate this project.
