WoW Mentoring NCS

Women of Wandsworth have taken part in Government's call for evidence into inter-generational connection, with aim to promote social integration. WoW Intergenerational program recognised this problem in 2010, when we started this project to bridge the obvious gap between the generations. Apart from solving this problem of social integration of elderly and young, our project integrated the UK citizens

and the people from abroad, who have unintentionally broken families due to the circumstances, which led them to leave their country of origin. It is highly commendable that NCS, National Citizen Service, recognised the value of Wow inter-

generational project and linked with us in partnership, to raise the next generation with this in view. NCS students cooked again a summer BBQ for our elderly in Battersea and enjoyed their company, as part of their volunteering training.



WoW Parent Forum

An issue has been raised by a local parent at our latest WoW Parent forum, about Go Ape expensive prices for local families. A single mother could not afford £100 this summer to take her 3 children to experience Go Ape adventure in Battersea Park. This is such an injustice, as they watched other children from more

affluent families swinging in the branches above them. We have heard from local schools, who applied for free Go Ape tickets, that they were rejected. All parents agreed that this wonderful opportunity for physical exercise and improving agility skills should be accessible to all children, not just from

our borough, especially when all youngsters ask to go to Go Ape on their birthdays and have these tickets on top of their Christmas wish list. We all agreed that at least the schools should have free or discounted access to these tickets, so all children could enjoy this activity together without segregation.

Headstart Refugees



All Party Parliamentary Group on Social integration called for evidence of intergenerational connection in UK. Women of Wandsworth took part in this enquiry with explicit benefits of WoW Intergenerational campaign since 2010. In light of our outstanding work in mentoring UK youth in intergenerational work, Women of Wandsworth have been asked to mentor the youth from

Headstart Refugee Project, through The Challenge organisation. Aim of this project is to deliver social action that will allow young refugees, who came legally to this country, the chance to socially mix, through running activities and enjoy games with people they would not usually meet, while getting involved in their community. Headstart project is a volunteer-

ing and employment program for young people. This is being piloted in Wandsworth, with the young refugees from CARAS organisation to help them to get into employment. These young refugees cooked a three course lunch for elderly from Battersea and organised fun games and bingo for them, with WoW Mums' support. Next WoW lunch with Headstart is in October.
