WoW Mentoring Headstart Youth

Headstart programme is a volunteering and employment programme for young people, which is currently running a pilot programme in Wandsworth with some refugee young people from organisation CARAS and helping them get into employment. This programme is being supported by Goldman Sachs, WoW Mums, The Challenge and Starbucks.

As part of Homestart, WoW Mums are mentoring young refugees, who are legally in UK, to deliver a social action project, that will allow them the chance to

socially mix and run activities with games for people they wouldn't usually meet, while getting involved in the community. This was a fully impactful event for

young refugees, WoW Mums and the elderly, where young people cooked for and entertained the older generation.

Free Go Ape Tickets

WoW Mums are pleased to announce the success and power of WoW Parent Forum after last months complaint by a mother who could not afford to take her local children to Go Ape adventure in Battersea Park. As a result of WoW Mums intervention, Wandworth Council agreed to give free tickets

to local children when the new season starts in spring. WoW Mums agreed that this will be done through Battersea Residents Associations, who will give these free Go Ape tickets to their neighbors' children.

This is a big benefit for our local community, especially children, but in addition to this. Residents Association might have a better turnout at their meetings and their membership will grow. This will of course increase the sense of community ownership by the local residents in their estates, which can only be very good news for our quality of life and camaraderie. Watch this space!

Bus 19 Campaign

I don't know if anyone has heard, but TfL want to cut the I9 bus route, so it no longer comes to south side of Battersea Bridge.

If you live in Battersea this gives us easy access to Hyde Park, Chinatown and Holborn. I can't believe they would cut us off when there is no direct alternative. And, to make it worse, they promised us that

they would keep the route when they redeveloped the Royal College of Art site, but here we are just a few years later and they are changing their minds. They haven't even consulted nor notified locals of this change - it's hidden deep on the website!


