We have heard the Mayor's promise that all public transport buses will be with zero emissions by 2020, but Alex Williams,

TfL Director, said that out of 9000 buses in London, only 167 are electric at the moment. Idling is a problem, especially in front of schools' playgrounds and in tunnels, which are used by elderly, parents and children on a school run. Parent's network got stronger after we heard that a child died of Asthma due to high air pollution in UK.
