Senia Dedic BEM has been invited to the APPG All Party Parliamentary Group's meeting at the Houses of Parliament to discuss the Education, SEND and Inclusion. This meeting examined what can be done to ensure we tackle the growing SEND problem

in London and across the country, with experts from the disabled children's sector, leading politicians from London boroughs and head teachers with best practice.

Seven London boroughs report that fifth of their

students identify as need-

ing special educational

needs SEND. Schools have financial restraints and lack of SENCOs to help with this problem. Additional problem is that Teachers are trained only one day in SEND. We asked the MPs to change the policy on SEND. The only good school is an inclusive school.
